Guided Interpretive Hike: Delacy Creek

Tuesday, August 17th – Meet in Grayling Dorm Lobby at 5:45 pm

Cost: \$1 Space is limited – Must pay in advance to reserve a seat

Distance: 6 miles – Hiking Time: 4 hours – Difficulty: Moderate

This trail is a must-do hike! As it alternately goes through meadows and lush forests, the trail follows Delacy Creek all the way to the lake. Once you arrive at the beach, you'll have an expansive view of rugged mountain peaks. Keep a lookout for sandhill cranes, coyotes and even moose.

Archeological Seminar

Thursday, August 19th – 7:00 pm in the Lake Recreation Hall

Learn about what archaeologists do, important sites in the Park, and how "history's detectives" piece together clues left behind to learn more about what life was like for people in the Park thousands of years ago. This presentation features pictures of actual digs in the Park, incredible finds at these sites, real artifacts recovered, shipwrecks, cabin ruins and more. Presented by Robin Park, Yellowstone National Park Archeologist. **Must provide own transportation.**
